We tried to direct it back in with the boat but as soon as it got close to shore it went back out into the water. It was trying to grab on to our oars and the rescue tube we put in the water so it was tired. We grabbed it out of the water and wrapped it in Chris's vest. We got it back to the club in the ATV and put it in the recycling bin with water until fauna rescue came. It also had a little Joey in its pouch."*

This good news story was picked up by all Adelaide News Crews, and Dayna Blythe even made it to a segment on channel Ten's "The Project". Well Done to all involved.

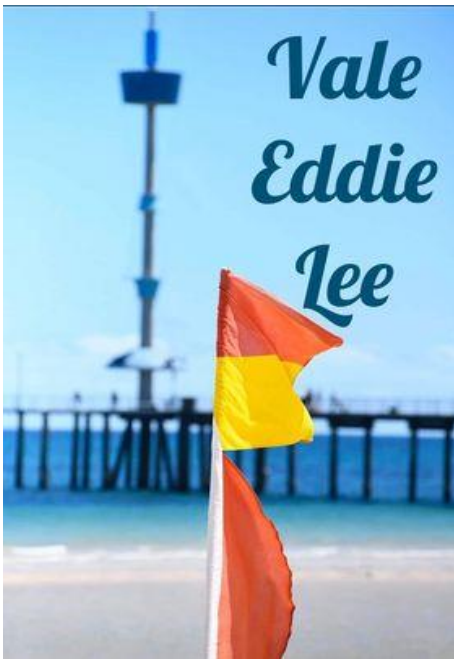
### **Social Media**
