

GENERAL CODE OF CONDUCT

As a person involved in any way with the sport of Surf Lifesaving, the following standard of behaviour is expected:

- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of others
- Be ethical, considerate, fair and honest in all dealings with other people and organisations
- Be professional in, and accept responsibility for your actions
- Make a commitment to providing quality service
- Be aware of Surf Lifesaving Australia's standards, rules and policies (<https://sls.com.au/wp-content/uploads/2018/11/Policy-6.05-Member-Protection-Policy.pdf>)
- Operate within the rules and spirit of the sport, including the national and international guidelines that govern Surf Lifesaving Australia
- Understand the possible consequences of breaching Surf Lifesaving Australia's Member Protection Policy (<https://sls.com.au/governance/#policies>)
- Immediately report any breaches of the Surf Lifesaving Australia's Member Protection Policy to the appropriate authority
- Refrain from any form of abuse, harassment or discrimination towards others.
- Refrain from intimate relations with members whom they have a supervisory role or power over
- Refrain from any form of victimisation toward others
- Provide a safe environment for the conduct of activities in accordance with any relevant Surf Lifesaving Australia policy
- Show concern and caution toward others that may be sick or injured
- Be a positive role model
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of their gender, ability, ethnicity, cultural background or religion
- Any incident that happens at a meet must be reported immediately to either Age Group Manager, Assistant Age Group Manager, any Club committee member or Child Safety Officer
